President's Report

The President's annual Report of an organisation normally presents a glossy over-view of the year's activities and is I suspect often not read.

As President of MNZ now for 4 years, I believe the members have a right to know the positives and the negatives.

In 4 years MNZ has gone from the moribund, closed shop society it was operating as, to one that is open and transparent to all members.

This year MNZ continued down its path to adopt and evolve to the changing conditions both in the current economic climate and in the way the clubs operate. MNZ's financial position has continued to improve to the point where the organisation is now in a stable viable financial situation.

This has seen more money available to enhance the Sport as a whole as well as to assist the Clubs and riders.

Grants from the FIM have allowed a 'New' website to be constructed, assisted the Coaching Coaches and Officials Training programmes, assisting with the sending of a 'Development" squad to the Motocross of Nations, freeing up money that has been able to be put into other projects.

As the prime mover for the 'New" Officials Training programme, there has been a great deal of personal satisfaction in the number of Officials, right through to flag marshals, who are all now operating on the same page.

No Board can operate successfully unless it works as a team; the current MNZ Board has worked as an efficient, cohesive team for four years now and looks to continuing.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the current Board for their valuable support and to the Life Members who are always available to help and encourage.

The bonds between MNZ and MA and the FIM are stronger now, to the benefit of all. It is something which I as President, have worked extremely hard to develop and maintain.

There are those who question the value of belonging to MNZ, both at rider and Club level.

The Board and the Commissioners have this year sought to make the benefits more real and tangible.

An MNZ run event is one at which the safety of the riders, Officials and spectators is paramount. We are constantly up-grading systems and responses to ensure the best possible outcome and preparedness for every situation.

Regretfully this year, there have been a number of deaths, both in practising for and in competition. MNZ fully investigates each incident in order to evaluate and learn from the causes.

Most importantly MNZ looks at prevention, wherever possible.

MNZ's rules and Constitution are there to protect everyone involved in the Sport To those individuals who try and bend the rules. It may not be you, but someone else who gets hurt

My origins in our Sport lie in Motocross and in Street Racing. I believe Street Racing along with closed circuits, is an area where MNZ faces its greatest challenges. Street Racing in particular is the most public platform riders have to introduce their Sport to the public. In order for it to continue, we must GET IT RIGHT.

To lose the right to race on the streets would be an irreplaceable loss to motorcycling

This year has seen the spectre of drugs & alcohol enter our Sport, MNZ has a zero tolerance on both.

As well as random testing by Drug Free Sport NZ, MNZ is instigating testing at all levels of participation.

As well as safety, my overall concern as President this year has been initiatives to encourage more riders within our Sport and ways of making Club interaction more effective.

MNZ has to move further into the area of 'Social Media'. In recent times the likes of lan Dawson www.nzsbk.com and Chris Ritchie www.facebook/nzmotocross have introduced some amazing innovations, which have greatly increased the flow of information to the wider public.

The age of relying on television coverage to enhance our sport is over.

I personally have been working on a major 'New' initiative, on ways of building MNZ's profile and the Sport's in general. All will be unveiled after the AGM.

MNZ must continue to change to meet the needs of its members and to survive as an organisation. Four years as President has given me major personal satisfaction in seeing Clubs such as Victoria MCC reach the level of professionalism; they showed in running the last round of the New Zealand Road Race Championships. To see the number of sidecars racing at this year's Championships was a major plus.

To witness the enthusiasm for Motocross by competitors as young as five-years-old at the recent Gold Nuggets, was simply amazing.

It is also great to see the numbers of older riders returning to the Sport either as riders or administrators. During our Championships this year, we have seen some of the best racing in the World.

We again had the year's first FIM Speedway Grand Prix at Western Springs and the feed-back from the riders was again astounding.

On the same weekend, I had the pleasure to escort Motorcycling Australia's President and FIM Oceania's President to the final round of our Road Race Championships, and they were full of nothing but praise for the racing and our facilities and organisation.

In finishing off, I would like to pass my sincere thanks on to the Staff of MNZ's Office for the fantastic job they do. Congratulate all of our Sporting Commissioners on their dedication to our Sport, as their roles are extremely hard and at times thankless.

Furthermore, 1 would like to thank our Officials, Safety and Recreational Commissioners for all their hard work, alongside our dedicated volunteers who without whose help our Sport would simply not function.

l came into the role of President, on a platform of change and accountability. l end my 4^{th} year knowing we have succeeded in safeguarding the financial stability and the Constitutional Structure of an Organisation l am passionate about and proud to be President of.

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the financial statements of Motorcycling New Zealand Incorporated on the pages stamped by BDO Waikato, which comprise the statement of financial position as at 31 December 2012, and the statement of movements in equity, statement of financial performance for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Those standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation and fair presentation of the financial statements in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

1 STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Motorcycling New Zealand Incorporated is an organisation incorporated under the Incorporated Societies Act 1908. It was established in 1916 to represent the interest of all motorcyclists and to provide opportunities for elite sports people to excel in global competition.

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting practice in New Zealand.

BASIS FOR PREPARATION

The measurement base adopted is that of historical cost.

Reliance is placed on the fact that the entity is a going concern.

Accrual accounting is used to match income and expenditure. All policies have been applied on a basis consistent with those used in previous years. The reporting currency is New Zealand dollars.

Differential Reporting

The entity qualifies for differential reporting exemptions as it has no public accountability as defined for accounting purposes and it is small. All available differential reporting exemptions allowed under the framework for differential reporting have been adopted with the exception that the entity has elected to not use income tax depreciation rates.

SPECIFIC ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following specific accounting polices that materially effect the measurement of profit and financial position have been adopted.

Accounts receivable

Receivables are stated at expected realisable value.

Goods and Service Tax (GST)

The financial statements have been prepared using GST exclusive figures with the exception of receivables and payables which are stated GST inclusive.

Property, Plant and Equipment and Depreciation

All owned items of property, plant and equipment are initially recorded at cost and, except for land, depreciated as outlined below. Initial cost includes the purchase consideration, or fair value in the case of a donated asset and those costs directly attributable to bringing the asset to the location and condition necessary for its intended use. These costs include, where appropriate, site preparation costs and installation costs. Costs cease to be capitalised when substantially all the activites necessary to bring an asset of the location and condition for its intended use are complete. All feasibility costs are expensed as incurred.



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NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2012

Subsequent expenditure relating to an item of property, plant or equipment is added to its gross carrying amount when such expenditure either increases the future economic benefits beyond its existing service potential, or is necessarily incurred to enable future economic benefits to be obtained, and if that expenditure would have been included in the initial cost of the item had it been incurred at that time.

Land and buildings are stated at historical cost.

Items of property, plant or equipment are written down immediately if an impairment in the value of the asset causes its recoverable amount to fall below its carrying amount. The impairment is recognised in the statement of financial performance.

Where an item of property, plant or equipment is disposed of, the gain or loss recognised in the statement of financial performance is calculated as the difference between the net sale price and the carrying amount of the asset. Any revaluation surplus is reduced or increased by the amount applicable to that item.

Income tax

Motorcycling New Zealand Incorporated is a sporting body exempt from paying income tax under section CW46 of the Income Tax Act 2007.

Grant Income

Grants received are recognised as revenue unless specific conditions attach to a grant and repayment of the grant is required where conditions are not met. In these cases a grant is treated as a liability until conditions have been met.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2012

Changes in Accounting Policies (Land and Buildings valuation)

Land and buildings were previously held at registered market valuation. The accounting policy has changed so that land and buildings are now stated at historical cost less accumulated depreciation and any impairment losses. The accounting policy has been made to comply with Financial Reporting Standard No. 3. The effect of recognising the land and buildings at historical cost rather than registered market valuation has resulted in a decrease in fixed assets and equity of \$150576. There was no effect on the statement of financial performance.
