- › MNZ widely distributes news and information about all its key activities and events through mainstream media such as magazines and newspapers, television and radio, MNZ website and via social media. This keeps members well informed and raises our profile around the world.

Technology

- › MNZ provides a mobile app to share news, upcoming events, rules and send notifications
- › Online system for clubs to manage their rider database, permits, events and reporting
- › QR codes for members which contain their license and logbook from events nationwide.
- › Database of officials and qualified stewards nationwide.
- › The MNZ website contains:

 - » Coaching resources

Safety and Documentation

- › For each MNZ permitted event, MNZ maintains a database of:

Why Become A Member?

By joining a club and purchasing a licence you become a member of MNZ — the national body responsible for the sport.

MNZ is recognised as the single body responsible for motorcycle sport in New Zealand. MNZ is also recognised by Sport New Zealand and the New Zealand Olympic Committee. All MNZ members have voting rights.

By bringing all forms of motorcycle sport together, MNZ is ensuring the long term future of the sport and taking it to funders, media, government, corporate sponsors and a host of other potential stakeholders.

As a sport we face a number of key issues — these are Health and Safety, financial, environment and community risks that need to be managed. MNZ is your advocate in all of these areas.

MNZ members can be certain that all MNZ events are managed to a set of written standards of safety and sporting rules. We are continuously improving our minimum standards and actively working with clubs and promoters to maintain consistency.

On behalf of all motorcycle codes and all MNZ members, MNZ maintains an active business relationship with key stakeholders including FIM, Motorcycling Australia, government agencies, funders, manufacturers and corporate businesses in New Zealand constantly identifying opportunities to grow our sport

Membership Benefits Summary

As well as voting rights, individual members are entitled to the following benefits.

Insurance

- › MNZ provides members with access to personal accident and travel insurance coverage for participation in FIM events overseas
- › MNZ arranges on behalf of its member clubs, officials and volunteers, insurance protection for litigation risk including;
 - » Third party personal injury and/or property damage arising in the course of permitted events
 - » Allegations of criminal wrongdoing
 - » Breaches of statutory regulations.

Licencing

- › MNZ issues licences to members allowing them to participate in all MNZ permitted events
- › MNZ provides all licence holders with a log book as a record of their racing programme
- › MNZ issues national rider numbers.

Permitting

- › Permitting of events by MNZ ensures riders that the event rules and event management meets MNZ standards
- › Permitting of an event brings it under MNZ's comprehensive insurance cover
- › MNZ permits between 800–900 events per annum.

Calendar

- › MNZ manages the calendar of events for all codes
- › This ensures that there are no regional or codeclashes in the event calendar..

Officiating

- › MNZ trains and insures its stewards
- › All MNZ stewards have access to a 24 hour 0800 number for issues of stewarding and safety priority.

Governing

- › MNZ is the owner of the Manual of Motorcycle Sport
- › All MNZ permitted events must be run in compliance with the rules
- › MNZ is continuously updating and improving its rules
- › MNZ provides all members with its Manual of Motorcycle Sport.

Protests/Appeals

- › MNZ provides a disputes procedure for all permitted events
- › Any member can appeal any decision of a steward through MNZ's Appeals
- › MNZ oversees drug testing on a random basis in accordance with worldwide conventions.

Results and National Ranking

- › MNZ collates results for all MNZ major events
- › MNZ maintains national rankings in all sports and age groups.

Equipment

- › MNZ sets the standards for:
 - » Bikes
 - » Fuel
 - » Helmets
 - » Other safety equipment
 - » Tracks
 - » First Aid.

Competitions

- › For all codes MNZ allocates and supervises:
 - » National Championships
 - » Age Group Championships
 - » Island Championships
 - » Oceania Championships
 - » Other major events.
