#### MEDICAL CLEARANCE LETTER REQUIREMENTS

If you have had an injury at a MNZ permitted event – you would have been placed on the Restricted Riders list. As we take your safety seriously, to be able to ride again we require you to produce a medical clearance certificate from your GP or specialist prior to returning to racing. This is outlined in the Manual of Motorcycle Sport, rule 6.2.

This medical clearance is to be provided to MNZ and must state that you "are fit to compete in Motorcycle Competition" to be taken from the restricted riders list.

If you are suspected to or have suffered a concussion, you will be placed on an automatic stand down period of 21 days as per Manual of Motorcycle Sport, rule 6.2a. After this stand down period, you will be required to produce a medical clearance certificate from your GP or specialist stating you "are fit to compete in Motorcycle Competition".

#### PROPOSED MX RULE CHANGE & RULE CHANGE PROCESS

Ray Broad - Motocross Commissioner, would like to announce that he is submitting a rule change this year in regard to the number of previous races required by Mini & Junior Motocross riders to compete in National/Championship events. See MoMS, Off Road, 15.19, currently all Mini & Junior Motocross riders are required to have competed in six previous events, proof of this shall be from entries in the rider's logbooks and can include up to a maximum of three One Event Licences. Ray would like to bring this in line with the Senior classes, that riders only require proof of three previous events.

This proposed rule change will be posted on the MNZ website by 28th February for member's feedback. Member's will be able to provide their feedback before 31st March.

Clubs & Commissioners have the authority to submit an application to change the rules in the Manual of Motorcycle Sport (MoMS) every year. If you would like to see a change or clarification to a current rule, please talk to your Club Secretary or relevant discipline Commissioner to look at having this submitted.

Rule change applications need to be received at the MNZ office by 28th February 2020.



#### **OFF ROAD RULE 4.10f ENFORCEMENT**

The Manual of Motorcycle sport, Off Road rule 4.10f states:

If minimum of 6 valid paid entries have not been received at the published closing date for normal entries (for clarity this excludes late entries and similar), then the Championship, GP, National or Island event class will not run for that year, provided that if the event is part of a series then this will apply only to that round; and 6

entrants must start said event (in official practice, qualifying or race). Host Clubs may apply to MNZ for dispensation of the above rule under special circumstances.

Motocross Commissioner, Ray Broad, would like to remind all Motocross and Supercross riders entering in the New Zealand 2020 Championship, GP, National or Island event classes that this rule will be fully enforced. This may mean the class is dropped from the program, run as a support class and/or Championship titles/points not awarded to riders in affected classes.

# **NEW MNZ WEBSITE UPDATE**


At long last we have begun the upgrade of the MNZ website with the aim to make it more visually appealing and user friendly. We have enlisted a focus group of

The 57th ISPS Handa Halberg Awards ceremony will be held on Thursday 13 February 2020 at Spark Arena in Auckland and televised live on SKY SPORT and free to air on Prime TV, the broadcast will include closed captioning.

The Awards were created by Olympic champion Sir Murray Halberg (ONZ) in 1963 to honour sporting excellence and as a major fundraiser for the Halberg Foundation – his charity which aims to enhance the lives of physically disabled young New Zealanders by enabling them to participate in sport and recreation.

To be recognised at this level as a finalist is outstanding, we have everything crossed for Courtney to take out this award.
