With barely a second to let it sink in, Dylan jumped straight into representing NZ as part of a team at the Motocross of Nations in the Netherlands (more to follow). Wyatt Chase-Maximus Purvis-Dylan Walsh: All three boys battled their hearts out representing Team NZ at the Motocross of Nations. The boys managed to Qualify 17th as a Team putting them through to the main event with Dylan 7th in MX2, Wyatt 19th in MXGP and Maximus 26th in Open. The race seemed to produce each of them with individual hardships with Wyatt pushing through the pain of a serious injuring he sustained to his leg in practice on the Wednesday, Maximus competing on a 250 in a class full of 450 riders and Dylan dislocating his ac joint in his shoulder. Incredibly the team still managed 19th overall and we have nothing but immense respect for all three. Thanks to

Liam Draper: Finishing an outstanding 1st overall in round 11 at the Grand National Cross-country Championship (GNCC) series in the XC2 (250cc) in Pennsylvania, USA.

Rachel Archer: Signed on to US Yamaha Team starting October 1st

Cormac Buchannan: Competing in the Oceania Junior Cup and selected to attend the Red Bull Rookies Cup Selection Event in October.

Jacob Stroud: Was invited to ride in the Supersport 300 class at the World Superbike in Magny-Cours, France.

Rogan Chandler: Earned a wildcard entry in the MotoGP in Phillip Island, he will be the first Kiwi to race in this event.

New Partnership

Motorcycling New Zealand has developed a partnership with WEM (Kevin Williams Management) and WEM will be offering all privateer New Zealand riders attending the MX Nationals in Australia 50% off the entry fee – this is a significant saving and we are keen to see more of our Kiwi riders taking the step across the ditch to crush the Aussies in this championship.



Health and Safety

We have recently delivered a draft Medic Guideline document to our affiliated clubs, with the ultimate goal to raise the level of medics and care for our members at permitted MNZ events. Whilst in some cases this is a higher cost, we are working with clubs to support funding applications to achieve the delivery of this across our sport. The level of qualification of medics will determine your care and this is important.

Concussion is high on our priority, we are part of an Oceania working group developing a Concussion policy for our sport – more to come on this over the next few months.

Yellow Flags – this rule has recently changed for Off Road – refer to Rule 6.17b which now states Yellow: Held Stationary or Waved – SLOW DOWN NOW. Please remember to take notice of the Yellow flags at all times, it is not cool to continue to race or jump as this could be you or one of your family members on the ground.
